<b>Assessment Intervention Center (AIC) Update, City of Indianapolis</b>	AIC opens December 1, 2020. Facility is voluntary. 30 beds available with turnover every four to five days to comply with social distancing.	<b>Q/A Post Meeting:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Q: Will there be any nutrition or food services provided through AIC programming? A: <i>Food and snacks will be provided by Eskenazi Health in order to assure a high level of nutritional quality.</i></li> <li>Q: There were several questions regarding the possible impact, either positive or negative, the AIC could have on the population of the Twin Aire neighbors who are homeless. Can you provide some more information on how the AIC might increase, decrease, or have no impact on the number of individuals who are homeless in Twin Aire and surrounding neighborhoods? A: <i>It is expected that many of the individuals staying at the AIC will be either homeless or at risk of homelessness. To our knowledge, the presence of the Reuben Engagement Center has not in the past increased the number of homeless neighbors downtown, and similarly we do not expect the presence of the AIC to increase the number of homeless neighbors in the Twin Aire neighborhood.</i></li> <li>Q: MCAT hours are 10am to 6pm, so will there be a clinician on site overnight? How many clinicians during the day? Will 24/7 clinical help be available? A: <i>There will be paramedics and nurses on site at AIC 24/7, so there is clinical support on site</i></li> </ul>

		<p><i>24/7 that will be capable of addressing emergencies. The Reuben Engagement Center currently operates without a mental health clinician at any time. While this reduces the amount of mental health assessment and referral that REC can provide, it does not pose a safety risk to the individuals staying there. The AIC will have one mental health clinician on site during the hours noted, providing an additional resource above and beyond what is currently available at REC. Every staff member of the AIC team plays an important role in engagement with AIC residents.</i></p>

# **Assessment and Intervention Center (AIC): Mission**

The Assessment and Intervention Center's goal is to divert individuals from ineffective punitive measures, including incarceration, and into appropriate care delivery models that provide rapid and integrated patient care, and to address mental health, addiction, homelessness and other socio-economic issues affecting life choices and criminal behavior.

# AIC PROGRAM

- AIC is a voluntary program. All individuals
  - Consent to AIC services
  - Are not a danger to self or others
  - Do not require incarceration
  - Do not require hospitalization
- Populations served:
  - Individuals with apparent behavioral health and/or substance use issues where law enforcement is trying to avoid
    - An arrest due to low level criminal offense
    - An involuntary detention to an emergency room for further behavioral health assessment
  - Any individual in need of connection to substance use and/or behavioral health treatment
- Referral sources:
  - Law enforcement, homeless shelters/outreach, emergency rooms, primary care offices, corrections, self-referral, and other entities serving the populations stated above



# AIC CORE SERVICES

- The following services are integral parts to the AIC model:
  - 24/7 referrals/intake
  - Assessment by licensed mental health clinician, paramedic or nurse, and resource coordination
  - Withdrawal Management
  - Skills Training
  - Daily engagement in goal development
  - Linkage to treatment/needed resources
  - Warm hand-offs to referred providers



# AIC TEAM

- Interdisciplinary team comprised of
  - **Site Manager:** program leader
  - **Team Lead:** operations supervision
  - **Medical Director:** oversight of medical protocols
  - **Licensed Mental Health Clinicians:** intake assessments, continued assessments, clinical overview
  - **Resource Coordinators:** needs assessments, linkage to recovery providers and community resources
  - **Paramedics and Nursing:** withdrawal management, physical health assessment, primary healthcare linkage
  - **Housing Specialists:** daily engagement, skills building, assistance with linkage



# Assessment and Intervention Center (AIC)

- Will open with 30-beds due to COVID-19 protocols
  - This ensures that clients are appropriately distanced for safety
- COVID-19 protocols are determined through collaboration of the Office of Public Safety, Marion County Health Department, and Eskenazi Health Infection Prevention and Facilities teams
  - Social distancing will be practiced
  - All staff, clients, and visitors will wear masks
  - Cleaning will follow advised COVID protocols

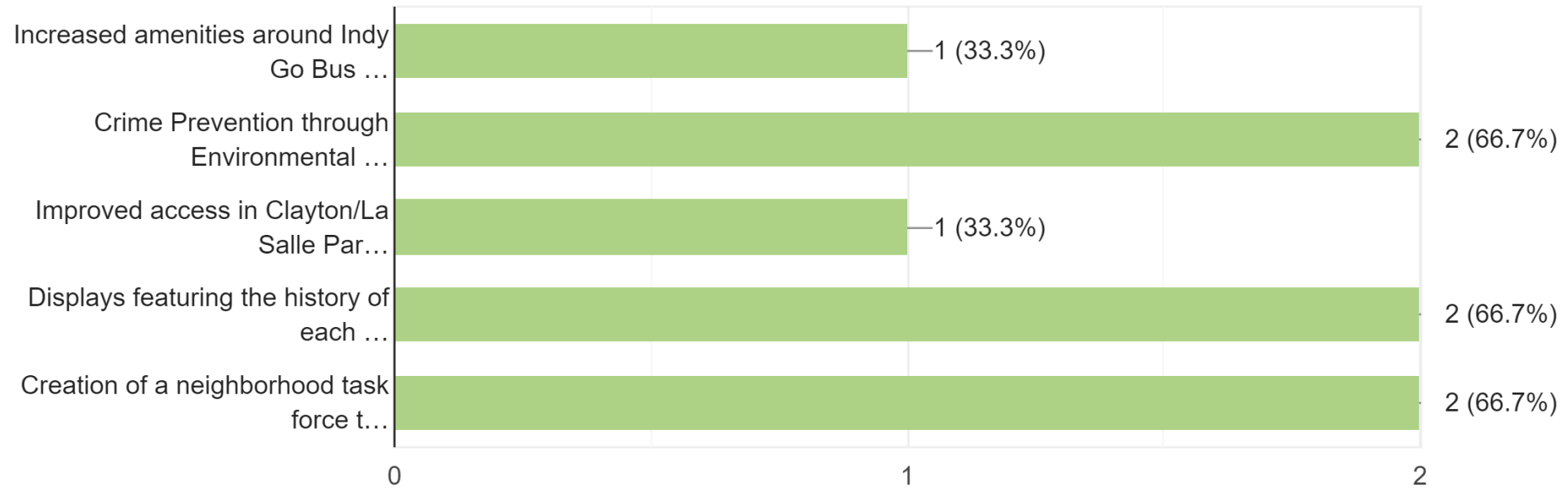


# Early Action Funds

- Extending the [survey](#) deadline to noon on November 19<sup>th</sup>
- Current Proposed Projects Include:
  - Increased amenities around Indy Go Bus Stops, including seating, trash containers, etc.
  - Crime Prevention through Environmental Design (CPTED) training for TANC community, along with implementation dollars for CPTED activities.
  - Improved access in Clayton/La Salle Parks by providing additional seating/benches.
  - Displays featuring the history of each neighborhood in area parks, including pocket parks, using material collected from seniors in the area.
  - Creation of a neighborhood task force to address crime.

# Livability New Proposals

- Concerns about traffic/accidents/poor driving
- Infrastructure improvements
- More lights/cameras needed (This could be a part of Crime Prevention through Environmental Design (CPTED) projects)
- Support for our neighbors without a home
- Neighborhood clean-ups
- Connector to pleasant run walkway

# Opportunity New Proposals

- Twin Aire Shopping Center improvements: Support for businesses and other façade etc. improvements
- Coworking share space
- Add a grocery store
- Add a farmer's market, possibly accessible in both warm and cold months

# Vitality New Proposals

- Work with local investors to buy small multifamily properties as opposed to only assisting large developers
- Offer low interest loans for people to fix up their property
- Create a land bank separate from renew Indy that is specific to Twin Aire goals

# Education New Proposals

- Merge housing and education/trade/skilled training by creating a program (or partnering with an existing program) where people receive construction type training on site by renovating/building housing in the area. Housing improvements could be used to help with affordable housing in the area.
- Add a theatre in Twin Aire
