| Indy Parks | Indy Parks shared about upcoming opportunities to participate in parks, future days of service for TANC area parks, and other announcements. | Councilor Jason Larrison | Councilor Larrison discussed topics related to the Community Justice Campus (CJC) including a brief update on the Circle City Forward initiative which includes capital investments including funding for parks and other facilities, as well as the CJC. He discussed how concerns have been raised as to how the new center will incorporate community justice reform and how the facility will engage or work with the neighborhood around it. Councilor Larrison also shared that he had met with Marion county judges who are proposing a new facility called the Youth and Family Services Center, which would replace the current juvenile justice center. Current plans for this facility state that it would reduce beds to 125 to 75, that they aim to grow schooling, vocational programming, and other options at the site. There are also plans to establish a day facility where kids can come to cool off as needed. The plan is also to move the courts to a one judge one family model so that when multiple cases exist in a household, the same judge is seeing them all, hence the need to have the Youth and Family Services center on the CJC campus. At this time, funding has only been approved for the design aspect, and there will be another City Council vote for the actual bond. | <p>Kismet Beer Company, Nicole Oesch</p> | <p>Nicole and her husband are working to open a brewery in the 201 Rural studios building (Newton and Rural). Both started out working at a local brewery for the last 4 years. For this new brewery, they plan to offer affordable options, only beer and wine, and to be open no later than 10PM.</p> <p>Questions for this portion of the meeting included: Q: Will there be food? A: Some light food, but may need to bring in food trucks or delivery options for more substantial food items? There was discussion of how food trucks would or would not work at this location. Q: What is the design/plan for parking? A: They are working with the owner to see if the lot in the back will work, but the lot is currently key entry only. There is also a lot the street and street available for parking. Q: Any thoughts on providing music? A: Yes, they are thinking about light acoustic etc., but nothing past 10PM</p> | |

| <p>Community Announcements</p> | <p>Ike McCoy, Mayor’s Neighborhood Advocate: People’s Planning Academy is accepting applications. This year will focus on bicentennial for Indy. They will provide a history of zoning and how it was used for better or worse in the past, and how to make it better moving forward.</p> <p>Ike also provided construction updates: Mid to late May will see continued road work, including at the future roundabout. The Citizens project is happening now. There will also be the north split project that will shut down that section in middle of May. This is a state INDOT road project and will be an 18-month complete closure between Washington street through the north split.</p> <p>Q: With the planned opening of the CJC, people who would use 65 south will have to have an alternate route due to this closure correct? A: Yes – alternate routes will be needed to travel around the north split closure. The roundabout will be completed by then, and unfortunately, we have no control on interstate closure re-routes as that is a state project. 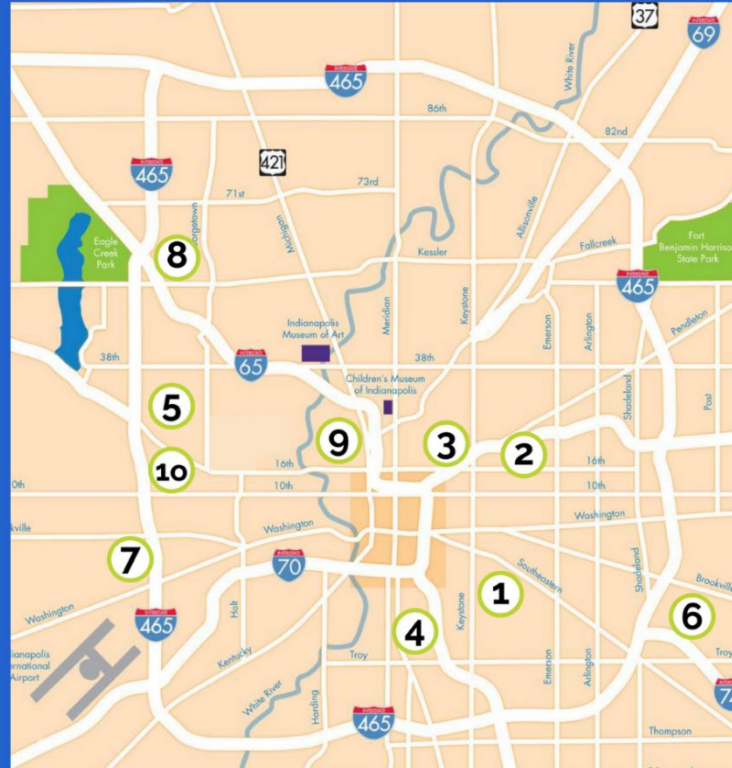
Guidelines

2020 NUMBERS

(Combined – includes shortened 6-month project season)

- Over 1,580 volunteers donated more than 11,000 on site volunteer hours
- 52 parks beautified / improved
- 15 playgrounds + 18 flower beds /landscaping areas weeded and fresh mulch spread
- Over 20 trails cleared of invasive species
- More than 375 picnic tables and benches re-painted
- 300-plus bags of trash/ debris and weeds cleared
